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



Case study 4: Monica

Monica is 54 years old. Another healthcare professional has advised Monica to come for screening today as she has had episodes of post-coital bleeding (PCB) for a few months. Monica stopped having periods when she turned 50 years old. Monica's medical history is as follows:

- Has had 6 children, all delivered vaginally without complications.
- Mild uterine prolapse
- Post-menopausal
